It's a privilege to do this work alongside you.



The legacy of Stephen Brown

In the spring of 2018, Stephen Brown and his wife Nancy, known by most as Nan, came home from one of their favorite places in the world: Yucatan, Mexico. They had been vacationing there for over 30 years, soaking in sun, food, and memories. Unfortunately, this trip ended differently than the others before. Steve wasn't feeling quite right, and what they thought might be a simple stomach bug turned into something far more serious.

After a series of tests, doctors found a rare cancerous mass in his ampulla, a tiny, sometimes overlooked part of the digestive system. This moment kicked off a journey the Brown family never expected, one filled with challenges, resilience, and a deep connection to North Memorial Health.

From the very beginning, Steve's care team at North Memorial Health Hospital - Robbinsdale went above and beyond. His surgeon, Dr. Gipson, someone Nan still talks about with admiration and gratitude, stepped in to perform an incredibly complex Whipple procedure. It was a long, grueling surgery, and just the beginning of Steve's fight. What stood out most to Nan and their daughter, Amanda, was more than the medical expertise, it was how they were treated as partners and integral members of his care team. They were never left in the dark. They were listened to. They were seen.

Donor spotlight

Steve's recovery had many ups and downs, ICU stays, setbacks, and rehab. But his care team never wavered. Nurses and therapists became like family, cheering Steve on as he set bold goals, like one of his favorite activities, winter camping at Lake Maria. And after months of hard effort, he did it. With sheer determination, endless hours training with recovery specialists (and a sled packed with gear), he was able to make a snowy mile-long hike back to the place he loved.

Steve later faced a heart condition that required a quadruple bypass, followed by a recurrence of cancer that led to his final chapter in hospice at North Memorial Health. Even then our team remembered him by name, stopping in to check on Nan and Amanda like old friends. The kindness they received wasn't just care; it was love in action. Nan recalls how, even in those final days, their family was treated with dignity, grace, and warmth, grounded in the community they had come to cherish.

Stephen Robert Brown passed away on June 14, 2023, at the age of 73. He was one of a kind. He loved the outdoors, worked in radio engineering, and was the type of person who never stopped asking questions. He left his mark quietly but deeply, on his family, on his friends, and now, through his wife's generosity, on the future of care at North Memorial Health.

After Steve's funeral, Nan and Amanda found themselves with extra cupcakes from the service. Without hesitation, they brought them to North - Robbinsdale Hospital, handing them out to the care teams and nurses who had been alongside them. It was a simple gesture that spoke volumes, reflecting Nan's giving spirit and her desire to keep Steve's memory alive through small, heartfelt actions.

It's this level of humanity that also inspired Nan to give back. The care they received wasn't just clinical, it was full of dignity, honesty, empathy, and heart. In honor of Steve and everything he meant to their family, Nan became a donor to the North Memorial Health Foundation, wanting other families to feel the same kind of comfort and compassion that carried them through their hardest days.



Steve's legacy lives on in every family helped, every caregiver supported, and every life touched by kindness at North Memorial Health. Their family's journey is a powerful example of how one life can echo through a community for years to come.

This cherished keepsake, made possible by donations to the hospice program, is a lasting symbol of love that families like Gaye's can hold onto forever.

World Breastfeeding Week

In August, our community celebrated the 2nd Annual World Breastfeeding Week Event at North Memorial Health – Maple Grove Hospital, and what a turnout it was! New and expectant families filled the space, finding both expert and peer support related to nutrition for their babies and the challenges that come with early parenthood.

A highlight of the event was the vibrant resource booths, where families connected with professionals and community organizations that truly understand their needs and goals. Moms and families engaged in meaningful conversations finding resources to support their breastfeeding and post-partum journeys. One attendee shared, “I needed this; it is so great to be surrounded by people going through the same stuff as me.”

The overwhelming success of this event reaffirms its importance, and we’re excited to continue this tradition again next year.



A second chance and gift for others

In August 2024, Larry Schnack suffered what’s commonly known as a “widow maker” heart attack. When paramedics arrived, he had just one request: “Take me to North.” He knew firsthand the level of care he’d receive—his wife, Carol, had worked at North Memorial Health for 20 years.

After arriving, North Memorial Health’s Emergency Department team moved quickly to assess Larry and coordinated with the heart & vascular team to rush him

upstairs to the catheterization lab. In minutes, they placed two stents that saved his life, but his journey didn’t end there. As part of his recovery, Larry completed 36 sessions of cardiac rehab, where he exercised with monitoring and help from his care team. It was during these sessions that he discovered a passion for rowing—so much so that he bought his own rowing machine for home.

Today, Larry is thriving. The education and support he received at North Memorial Health’s rehab unit played a vital role in setting him up for a longer, healthier life.

As he neared the end of his program, Larry wanted to give back. He donated a new state-of-the-art rowing machine to the rehab unit—ensuring that others working toward their own cardiac recovery would have access to the best equipment possible.

The healing power of music in the NICU

In 2023, the Minnesota Neonatal Foundation helped bring the gift of music therapy to the North Memorial Health – Maple Grove Hospital NICU. This program quickly became a source of comfort for our tiniest patients and their families, easing stress and creating moments of connection.

Recognizing its impact, the Minnesota Neonatal Foundation increased their support from \$25,000 in 2023 to \$40,000 in 2024, expanding therapy from 10 to 15 hours per week. Now, more families can experience the healing power of music during their NICU journey.

Thanks to our amazing team and programs like this, many funded through generosity, our NICU is not just about medical care—it's about hope and healing.

Small grants

Upgraded support for breastfeeding families

Fueled by passion and advocacy, our Family Birth Center team identified an important need to renovate a lactation care space at North Memorial Health – Maple Grove Hospital. By incorporating thoughtful enhancements—fresh paint, inclusive artwork, an adaptive room layout, and specially designed chairs to support breastfeeding—the team transformed the space into a welcoming haven for new parents. Since reopening, team members have cared for nearly double the number of new mothers, increasing from 682 in 2023 to 1,363 in 2024, all within a calming and accessible environment that supports families' needs with comfort and ease.



Meeting diverse spiritual needs

Our spiritual care team expanded resources to better serve our increasingly diverse community by introducing prayer rugs, Bibles, Torahs, Qur'ans, prayer beads, disposable hijabs, and educational materials. They have also added training in the hospitals for our Chaplains and care teams to better understand patient needs during significant religious events and celebrations.

These additions have had a positive impact on the experience patients, families, and team members have at North Memorial Health. By providing these resources, our team members not only meet important religious and spiritual needs during stressful times but also ensure that every individual feels seen, valued, and supported.

Small Grants



Halo BassiNests

This year, the incredible postpartum team at North – Maple Grove Hospital finished replacing all the bassinets at the Family Birth Center with HALO BassiNests—a multi-year grant project.

The HALO BassiNests offer numerous features that enhance comfort for new moms, especially those recovering from a C-section. They provide 360-degree rotation, allowing the bassinet to be easily positioned over the bed, giving moms in recovery safer and easier access to their baby. The legs can tuck under the bed to save space and prevent accidents, and the clear basin allows for easy visibility, making it safer for everyone, including siblings. With nearly one-third of our deliveries via C-section, having a more comfortable and accessible solution makes a difference in our patients' recovery experience.



Trauma symposium

The 2024 Trauma Symposium, “From Pain to Progress: Bringing Trauma-Informed Care to the Heart of Healing,” was designed in response to our Community Health Needs Assessment. Bringing together 132 participants, including 77 North Memorial Health team members, the symposium served as a platform for advancing trauma-informed care.

Numerous studies have documented connections between experiencing significant trauma and a wide range of adverse health outcomes across a person's lifespan. These outcomes include depression, anxiety, loneliness, heart disease, sexually transmitted infections, substance use, and suicide attempts. The Community Engagement Advisory teams at both hospitals identified life-impacting traumas as a priority health issue for 2023-2025, based on the needs of our community.



IV placement technology

Even small discomforts can feel overwhelming for patients facing a medical crisis. Our specialized IV team knows that quickly and gently placing an IV can significantly reduce patient anxiety before a procedure. Reducing anxiety plays a key role in treatment success.

To enhance comfort and safety, the team acquired an ultrasound machine to increase the chances of placing IVs on the first attempt. This improves the patient experience and reduces the need for more invasive central lines, lowering the risk of bloodstream infections. With ultrasound technology available during every interaction, the team provides precise, patient-centered care.

Education in our community

Injury prevention

One in ten people sustain an injury in their lifetime requiring emergency treatment, and accidents remain a leading cause of death and disability. Our trauma team, with support from the Foundation, leads injury prevention outreach through events, workshops and classes, equipping individuals with the skills to protect themselves and their loved ones.

In 2024 our team:



Distributed 193 bike helmets at 5 bike helmet fitting events.



Led 10 Stop the Bleed® events with a total of 178 participants and distributed 132 bleeding control kits.



Inspected 134 seats at 10 car seat clinics. 68.3% of car seats arrived incorrectly installed—100% left safely corrected!



Facilitated three 7-week Stepping On falls prevention classes with a total of 512 hours of contact with participants.

BIPOC Mental Health academic scholarship

Access to providers who represent and reflect an individual's background is essential to their wellbeing. In support of this need, the Foundation partnered with our mental health team to increase opportunities for students of color pursuing careers in the mental health field. There is currently a shortage of mental health professionals with diverse backgrounds.

Maia has been passionately advocating for the mental wellbeing of marginalized youth since 2020. With a background in education, she began as a mentor at the Brooklyn Avenues Shelter for Homeless Youth, where she focused on LGBTQ+ youth experiencing homelessness, providing personal counseling, and leading discussions on their struggles.

Maia graduated from Minnesota State University, Mankato in 2024 and began working at Reclaim in the fall as a therapist. She is also co-authoring a study with Dr. Kerry Diekmann on BIPOC LGBTQ+ intersectionality and student feelings of belonging. Maia frequently advocates for intersectionally marginalized youth, having spoken at the 2024 Minnesota Association for Children's Mental Health conference and at the Minnesota State Capitol for the 2024 Transgender Day of Visibility.

Even early in her career, Maia has demonstrated signs of becoming a pioneering leader in mental health care. We eagerly anticipate the positive impact she will continue to have on our community, particularly for underrepresented LGBTQ+ and BIPOC youth.

"As a Black and Latina trans woman, I am intimately aware of the struggle and inequality that marginalized youth face. I aspire to become a therapist because I believe that mental health support for racial minorities and LGBTQ+ individuals is most powerful when provided by someone who understands their context. There is a desperate need for more providers from these communities, and I aim to meet this call."






